Since over two thousand years, artists who paint, draw, and sculpt, have understood that the human body is highly organized. Nothing is random.

There is a reason for every nuance of modeling, every turn of the contour, all the effects of light, action, and structure.

Over the centuries, a body of knowledge about the inherent organic principles embedded in the figure has been evolved.

We must thoroughly assimilate these principles, make them part of our understanding. This aspect of art is a science.

As in the other sciences, with the passage of time, building upon the past, new knowledge is added, discoveries are evolved. A new interpretation of form is created.

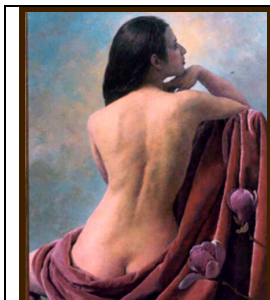
The past must be understood, but there is no need to repeat it. There is a dynamic vigor in discovery, while an imitation of the past will necessarily lack the excitement of a new vision.

The figure painting I see today is largely a rehash of 19th Century styles, often skillfully rendered, but without depth, overly simplified and generalized.

Restructured Realism is a style for the Information Age. It contains vastly more information about the body, and the actions of light, than was current in the 19th Century. It reaches a new level of complexity, a truer vision, with a closer suggestion of the brightness and freshness of nature's palette.

If you have the motivation and tenacity to learn an advanced vision, a new reality, I will do my best to transmit this understanding.

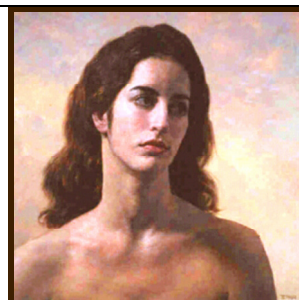

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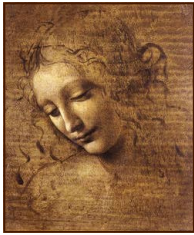
